FBCAS Monthly Shelter Statistics Report – June 2019

From June 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019, the overall save rate for FBCAS was 91%. The save rate for dogs was 96% and for cats it was 88%. *

- 116 feral/community cats were returned to field as part of our Community Cat Program for June 2019.

Dogs:

- The save rate does not include 3 dogs that were owner requested euthanasia (ORE) for the month of June 2019. All three were head to lab bite investigations.
- One dog was humanely euthanized at FBCAS after testing positive for Parvo.
- Four dogs died in care.
 - One 5 week old puppy died in foster care after failing to thrive.
 - Two dogs died at outside vet offices. One was a senior who was humanely euthanized after having difficulty breathing and stopped eating. One was a stray that was brought in barely breathing and testing positive for Parvo.
 - One was severely injured in the field.
- One dog was lost in care.

Cats:

Once again, FBCAS experienced a very high intake for our kitten population under 5 months old – 106. We struggled with the number of kittens who come in as neonates who failed to thrive and the babies who are already suffering from illness before they are brought into the shelter.

- In June, we lost 16 kittens under 5 months old that died in care and were either failure to thrive or had upper respiratory infections that did not respond to treatment.
- Nine kittens were humanely euthanized at FBCAS for medical reasons.

* Beginning and ending shelter totals have an acceptable variance of .5% due to database variances in intake and outcome dispositions of the shelter population.

*Formula used: Intake minus all euthanasia outcomes divided by intake minus owner requested euthanasia
